Clairemont Community Day

<p>Clairemont Community Day is a previously semi-annual event held at the school. Our school community comes together for a few hours on a Saturday to complete school beautification projects. In the past this has included, weeding flower beds, painting paw prints on the sidewalk, power washing, painting benches, planting flowers, and miscellaneous inside projects including painting the bathrooms and classrooms. This year, the event will only be held outside and the tentative to do list is painting benches, pressure washing the large urns at the front of the school, replacing the plants in the urns as they are dead, and lots of weeding various beds throughout the school.</p>			
When do you propose beginning this activity in person, why do you propose that date, and what will the impact be if in-person activity is delayed until after that date?			
<p>We are proposing the date of Saturday October 17th from 9-3. We chose this date for cooler weather since people will be working outdoors and it did not conflict with any known district or local events. If the date is postponed to a later date the impact would be that the projects would not be completed, we may have trouble getting volunteers (although we have not started marketing this date until we had approval), and we risk colder weather.</p>

<p>The benefits of this event is that the school will be cleaned up and ready for the return of some of our students in late October. In addition to the clean up of our school, this event creates a sense of community and pride. The children enjoy participating and taking care of their school. This event could be particularly important for our new kindergarten families that have never been to the school or seen the property. This would give them a chance to see what Clairemont the building is like, in addition to the amazing community that attends the school.</p> <p>The risks of not doing this event in person is that the projects will not be completed and an opportunity for community and school pride will be lost.</p>	<p>The risks of doing this project is the small chance of exposure to COVID 19. I cannot foresee any other risks at this time. The benefits for not returning in person are none. This project cannot be done virtually so there are no benefits for not returning.</p>
<p>Describe in detail the protocols, equipment, and other actions that will be implemented to protect the health and safety of the persons involved in this activity:</p>	
<p>We will have a sign up online in the weeks preceding this event. A max of 15 people will be allowed to attend for 2 hour time slots. All participants will wear a mask. We will assign tasks to the participants. If a family comes together, they will be the only ones assigned to a project and a minimum of 6 feet will exist between one project and another. If an individual comes to the project alone, they will be assigned to an area that has people in the vicinity so they are not alone, but they will not work on the same project as another family or individual. If there are communal tools such as shovels or paint brushes (although we will limited this), gloves and hand sanitizer will be provided.</p>	
<p>Describe in detail how the above protocols, equipment, and other actions will be monitored to ensure compliance and fidelity of implementation, including who will be responsible for each aspect of monitoring:</p>	
<p>The PTA will have at least two members in attendance all day watching and making sure masks and space protocols are adhered to. I will be there all day and will be in charge of monitoring the activity for compliance with our guidelines. There will be a check in table with hand sanitizer for anyone that needs it and we will have our protocols listed in plain sight. There will be no food or drink provided and no communal gathering. The hand sanitizer and gloves will be purchased by the PTA and I will bring them on the day of the event. If we have any problems with our protocols, the individuals will be asked to leave.</p>

<p>This event is completely voluntary.</p>	<p>There are no consequences for anyone not choosing to participate. PTA members are not required to be present for this event nor are any of students, staff, or parents.</p>

<p>There are no interactions with those outside the district. The only interactions will be amongst their peers and families of Clairemont. There is a small chance of exposure to COVID however, since we are outside, wearing masks, grouping households together, and maintaining social distancing, I think the risks will be mitigated to a large extent.</p>

<p>The Clairemont PTA board hopes you will consider allowing us to have this event. Our community needs us and the school. This event has always been so successful and heartwarming. Watching the students get involved and taking ownership of their school is truly special. It creates a sense of pride and a spirit of community, and right now, we could use each other.</p>
